

There is a variety of products out there but none are registered to be used on quandongs. I do not know what other growers use. Have any quandong growers had any experience on this at all?

There is a product called ALTACOR which we would like to trial and get it registered. Would anyone in the group have the knowledge as to where and how to go to achieve this?

Myrtle rust: a threat to native vegetation arrives in the Eastern states

The disease myrtle rust, which is new to Australia and affects many of the members of the Myrtaceae family of plants, has been reported along the NSW and SE Queensland coast.

Apart from the potential impact on our native vegetation generally, several native food species are known to be affected: these are lemon myrtle, aniseed myrtle and riberry.

It is probably just a matter of time before this disease spreads more widely within Australia. Muntries are possibly also a host for this disease – we don't know yet.

In the past two months, the strategy in NSW has changed from "attempt to eradicate the disease" to "manage and live with the disease". Quite a lot of activity and energy is being put into developing the management strategy.

Some issues: quarantine, hygiene, severity of impact, possible control measures.
